FORRESTON HIGH SCHOOL CHOIR HANDBOOK 2019-2020

This handbook is designed to give a better understanding of the policies, rules, and regulations of our choir program to the students involved and their parents. If there are any questions, you may contact me at any time.

PHILOSOPHY: The instructor believes that music is as important to the development of the total individual as other academic courses, and an understanding and appreciation of music will lead to a more fulfilling life. GOAL: Our goal is to provide as many quality musical experiences to as many students as our resources allow.

EXPECTATIONS:

1. Students will:

- a. try to the best of their abilities to improve themselves and their ensemble every day.
- b. Work with the director in a spirit of teamwork and cooperation.
- c. come prepared every day with materials
- d. receive instruction and criticism constructively and apply it to their singing/playing for improvement.
- e. maintain their materials in top condition.
- f. care for all school equipment properly.
- g. attend and be on time to all performances.
- h. pay fees for supplies in a timely manner.

2. The director will:

- a. provide instruction so that the student can develop as a musician.
- b. provide the students with music that is within their abilities to perform but provides a challenge to grow.
 - c. be prepared for rehearsals.
 - d. inform the students and parents of all performances and extra rehearsals with enough lead time to arrange schedules.

3. Parents will:

- a. supply their child with appropriate materials and supplies.
- b. support their child by attending their concerts and other performances.
- c. encourage their child to perform other than with the Forreston HS Choir.

CLASS VS. EXTRACURRICULAR / ATTENDANCE: Choir cannot be placed exclusively into either one of these categories due to its very nature. All performances, even though they take place outside of school time, are considered schoolwork. Some of these events will be of such a nature that no excused absences will be granted, except sickness or death in the family. Examples include but are not limited to IHSA organizational contest and concerts. Some events will not be as critical to the education of your child or the performance of the choir as a group, and reasonable excused absences may be allowed. Please remember that the director and the principal are the parties responsible for issuing excuses. We must constantly weigh the good of the group against the good of the individual, and all requests for excused absences are considered very carefully. You must trust us to make the right decision not only for your child, but for the group as well.

EXCUSED ABSENCES: In the event that there is a conflict between a choir activity and something else on The contents of this syllabus are subject to change in accordance with the needs of the instructor/class.

your student's schedule, please consult with me at the earliest possible moment. Many times conflicts can be worked around, and I am much more likely to excuse a student if I have plenty of time to substitute for him or her. No excused absences (except illness or death in the family) will be granted less than 10 days before an event. No medical excuses will be accepted that excuse a student from a Choir activity so that they may participate in another activity, i.e. missing the Christmas Concert so the student might be healthier for an event the next day. A student's work schedule is not generally considered a valid excuse. Students who are too ill to perform or have had a family emergency must have their parent call me **BEFORE** the performance. The student will be given the opportunity make up all excused absences, including absences due to sickness, before the quarter is over with projects determined by the director. These projects can be written reports, performances of solos, attendance at other concerts, etc. Failure to complete these projects will result in a failing grade for the event.

ELIGIBILITY: In order to participate in certain Choir activities, students will have to maintain academic eligibility as outlined in the Forreston HS Extra-Curricular Handbook or IHSA regulations. These activities include but are not limited to:

- Chamber Choir/Madrigal Choir
- IMEA Activities
- Musical/Variety Show
- Show Choir
- IHSA Solo/Ensemble and Organizational Contest

In the event a student becomes academically ineligible to participate in an activity he or she will be given alternative assignments. There will be no penalty for non-participation due to ineligibility.

UNEXCUSED ABSENCES: Unexcused absences will result in a failing grade for the nine weeks grading period in which they occur. Students may be denied the opportunity to return to the ensemble for which he or she failed to perform.

UNIFORMS: Your student has been issued a choir robe for which they are financially responsible. Replacement cost for H.S. Choir robes is (last quote) \$150.00. These uniforms will be kept at the High School. We do not allow any eating or drinking (except water) while in uniform. Uniforms must be hung up properly after each use or points will be deducted from the student's grade for that event. When a student is in uniform it will be worn correctly, completely, and fully at all times. This means the robe will be zipped, stole will be worn F up and straight, black dress pants, black socks, and black shoes (No open-toed shoes) will be worn underneath (shirt can be a T-shirt). On the rare occasion that the director changes the manner in which the uniform is work, her directions will be followed explicitly. The only jewelry allowed while wearing the robe is stud earrings or rings - no necklaces or bracelets of any kind will be worn with the uniform. Hair should be styled for performance.

REQUIRED MATERIALS/EQUIPMENT:

- 1. Black shoes, closed toe
- 2. Black socks
- 3. Black pants
- 4. Black tights (Madrigals, as needed).
- 5. Pencil

MUSIC: Students will be issued music throughout the year. It is to be kept neat and in good condition. Make any marks on music with pencil only. GRADES: Choir grades encompass classroom work, which includes singing individually as well as being a contributing voice to the whole ensemble rehearsal. Grades also include any homework assignments, projects, or tests that are given.

AWARDS: Forreston High School Choir recognizes excellence in music performance with the following awards:

- Outstanding Choral Award Senior who contributes the most to the success of the choir through their performance skills, leadership, participation, and attitude.
- 2. Frederic Chopin Piano Award Student accompanist who contributes the most to the success of the choir through their performance skills, leadership, participation, and attitude.
- 3. Shipoopi Award Student(s) participating in the musical/variety show who contributes the most to the success of the musical/variety show through their performance skills, leadership, participation, and attitude.

FINE ARTS TRIP: Senior students who have been in a fine art *all eight* semesters of high school and are in good standing shall be allowed to participate in the annual Fine Arts Trip to Chicago. Students will be responsible for payment and will be allowed one fundraiser their freshman, sophomore, junior, and senior years.

MUSIC PATRONS: As the parent of a music student you are automatically a member of this organization. The Patrons do a tremendous job in supporting the various programs and events we undertake; we could not function without them. Help in making your student's musical experience the best it can be by participation in the Music Patrons and helping them with their projects.

CONTACT: If at any time you have any questions about your student, the choir program, or anything I can help with, you may contact me to discuss. Because I travel between two different buildings, calling the school directly may not always be the best option. I will likely not answer during the school day, but leaving me a message assures that I will return your call.
